

Klahanie School COVID-19 — Policies and Procedures for Phase 2 (Indoor-Outdoor Classrooms)

Health Policies

Phase Plan for Klahanie School

1. When To Stay Home Guidelines
 - a. If a student or working parent has had a known/suspected exposure to COVID19. They will stay home for 14 days or until they have a negative test result and a note from their PCP.
 - b. If a student is exhibiting any of these symptoms: cough, fever of 100.4 or higher, chills, shortness of breath, muscle aches, or loss of smell/taste: the student **MUST** stay home until the symptoms have ceased (without the aid of medication) for at least 72 hours **AND EITHER:**
 - at least 10 days have passed since their symptoms first appeared
 - OR**
 - they have seen their PCP and received a negative test result and/or a note indicating that COVID19 is not suspected as the cause of the above symptoms.
2. In the case of a known exposure to COVID-19:
 - a. If a person who has been in attendance at the school is diagnosed with COVID-19, the school will close in-person classes for 14 days and return to remote learning-Circle during that will be optional, enrollment and tuition remains the same.
 - b. If a family member of a Klahanie School student (who has not been in attendance at school) tests positive with COVID 19, that student will not return to school for 14 days. School will close for the time needed to fully disinfect the space, assess the safety of returning to school, and consult with teachers. Alternatively, the board may choose that school will close until the student has had a negative COVID19 test or 14 days have passed, whichever is sooner.
 - c. All Klahanie School families will be notified **immediately** if someone in attendance at school tests positive for COVID19 or if a non-working family member tests positive for COVID19. In all cases the confidentiality of the family will be respected. Information shared with the school at large will be: class where exposure may have happened, last day that exposure occurred, and nature of exposure (student/working parent/teacher vs. non-working family member).
3. In the case of the following scenarios an emergency board meeting will be held to determine whether school will remain open:
 - a. If there are more than 10 new cases reported on Vashon within one week
4. All adults and all children must wear masks while at Klahanie School as required by King County Public Health Department. This includes parents/guardians dropping off or picking up students even if they do not enter the grounds. Masks or appropriate face coverings are recommended for children 2 and up, provided that they can avoid touching it and hand washing each time touching occurs. Masks are not appropriate for children under age 2. Parents are encouraged to help their child practice wearing a mask at home.
5. Social Distancing in the classroom:
 - a. Parents, Teachers, and Parent Instructors will maintain distance from one another.

- b. Children will be encouraged, but not forced, to maintain distance, and given age appropriate redirection.
 - c. In the case of physical injury or emotional distress a teacher or working parent will meet the child's need in the safest possible manner.
6. If a child becomes sick during class he or she will be monitored in the west side gated area until a parent or caregiver can come pick them up.
 7. A family traveling out of state, family members will be required to quarantine 14 days before re-entering school. They will stay home for 14 days or until they have a negative test result and a note from their PCP.
 8. If a family member in the household travels via airplane and out of state for work, family testing is required following 14 days of family quarantine each return before re-entering school. They will stay home for 14 days or until they have a negative test result and a note from their PCP.
 9. If an out of state family or friend visit is planned with shared living space, without masks or distancing, families are required a 14 day quarantine before re-entering school. They will stay home for 14 days or until they have a negative test result and a note from their PCP.

Klahanie School Executive Director will maintain safety protocols and revision updates. All revisions are reviewed and approved by Klahanie School board with the understanding that these tough calls are for the welfare of the school, staying in operating and upholding due-diligence to, as a goal, keep cases at zero and serve safety to our community, especially for the number of individuals with vulnerable high risk factors. Thank you for helping care for this group of students and families and educators learning sustainable safe practices connecting, thank you for helping protect that.
